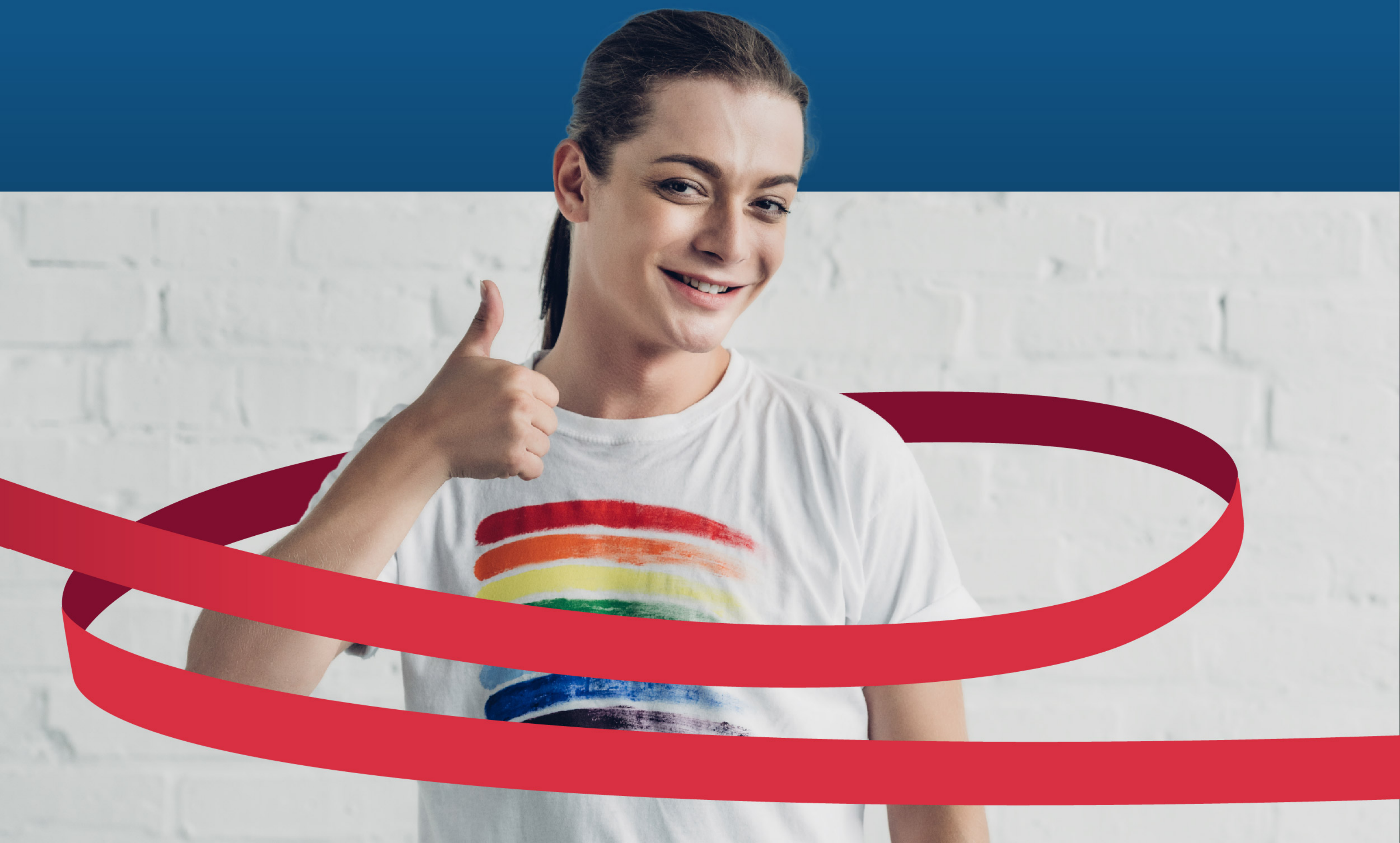


4 things to know about HIV:

1 | You can have HIV and not know it



2 | There is no cure, but with timely diagnosis and medical care, HIV can be controlled



3 | HIV is not transmitted by kissing, hugging, shaking hands, or sharing food or water



4 | HIV can be passed on through blood, semen, vaginal fluid and breast milk
